Abstract *Background:* The purpose of this study was to determine the prevalence of self-reported depression among a sample of young adults in the United States. *Methods:* Data were obtained from the 2004 National Longitudinal Study of Adolescent Health, a nationally representative sample of adolescents and young adults. *Results:* The prevalence of self-reported depression was 10.3% among the sample. The prevalence was higher among females than males, and among those with lower socioeconomic status than those with higher socioeconomic status. *Conclusions:* The prevalence of self-reported depression among young adults in the United States is higher than the prevalence among the general population. The prevalence is also higher among those with lower socioeconomic status than those with higher socioeconomic status. *Keywords:* Depression, prevalence, young adults, socioeconomic status.

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
